Notes

Registration Fee: A one-time non-refundable registration fee of SFr 2'000 is payable when the Application Form is submitted.

Joining Fee and Deposit: A joining fee and deposit of SFr 14'000 is required in addition to the fees set out above. SFr 10'000 will be refunded after the student leaves Aiglon and when the account is fully settled. SFr 4'000 will be used for funding bursaries and scholarships. See Financial Conditions on the next page concerning deposit refunds.

Aiglon College Alumni Eagle Association: The charge of SFr 2'000 is included on the first term's invoice only, following which the student is a fully-paid up life member of the ACAEA.

Initial Clothing Charge: There is a one-time initial clothing charge for the standard school clothing, including uniform. This does not apply to all Day students.

Health Insurance: There is a compulsory health insurance premium for those students who are not covered by a Swiss health insurance policy. The premium for students aged 8 to 18 is in the region of SFr 2'220, which covers the whole year. The full adult premium (in the region of SFr 6'750) is payable as of the calendar year in which students turn 19. Bills for out-patient (ambulatory) medical treatment are reimbursed to 90% after being charged to the student's account. Hospitalisation, accidents and repatriation are covered 100%.

Pocket Money: Pocket money is charged in advance with the fees for Junior School students.

VAT: VAT is chargeable on the school account. The amounts above include Swiss VAT at the appropriate prevailing rates. Details of rates and amounts charged are given on the Invoice.

The Aiglon Fees include:

- Class tuition
- Accommodation and all meals for boarders (lunch only for day students)
- Physical Education, CAS and Expeditions programmes, including trips to sporting events and matches
- Residence tax (taxe de séjour) and permits
- Loan of text books and other materials for class (some may need to be bought)
- Use of school Library, computer network and other resources
- Laundry for boarders only (but not Dry Cleaning)
- Pastoral Care including tutoring
- Expeditions, including Cultural Long Expeditions
- IB fees
- Ski pass (boarding students only)
- Winter equipment
- Ski locker
- On-site healthcare
- Travel insurance for trips and excursions

The Aiglon Fees do not include the following items, which are billed twice each year, in February and July:
